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GENERAL INFORMATION

Founding

The University of North Carolina opened its doors to students on January 15, 1795 as the first state university. New Hope Chapel (now Chapel Hill) was chosen for its central location as the site of the University. Hinton James, the first student to enroll, arrived in February, 1795. By March 1 the University had 41 students and 2 professors. Seven students, including Hinton James, received their diplomas in 1798, becoming the first graduating class of the University. Authorized by the State Constitution in 1776, the University was chartered in 1789, and was the only public university in the nation to award degrees to students as early as the eighteenth century.

Organization

The University was consolidated in 1931 with the Women's College at Greensboro and North Carolina State College at Raleigh under a single Board of Trustees. In 1971 the General Assembly redefined the University of North Carolina System to include all 16 of the four-year public higher education institutions in the State. The Board of Governors was established as the governing body responsible for all basic policies for the University of North Carolina as a multi-institutional university.

UNC-Chapel Hill and the other institutions that comprise the UNC System each has its own separate administrative structure. The 16 constituent institutions and the year they were founded are listed below.

Total student headcount of the university for fall 1991 is 23,794 which is down slightly (58 students) from 1990. Converting the enrollment to a full time equivalent basis (FTE) yields 21,391.25; the conversion is based on a minimum full-time load for undergraduates of 12 credit hours, for graduate students 9 credit hours and for professional students 9 hours.

Fall 1991**

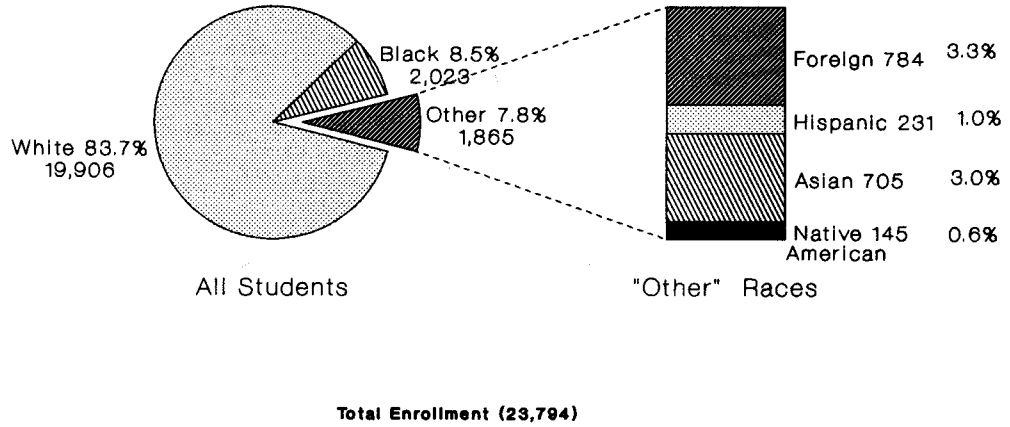

Fall 1991**

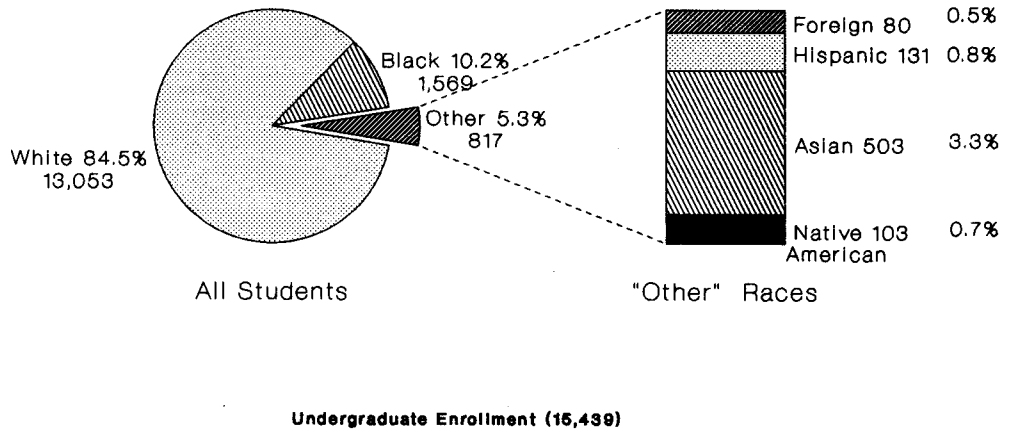
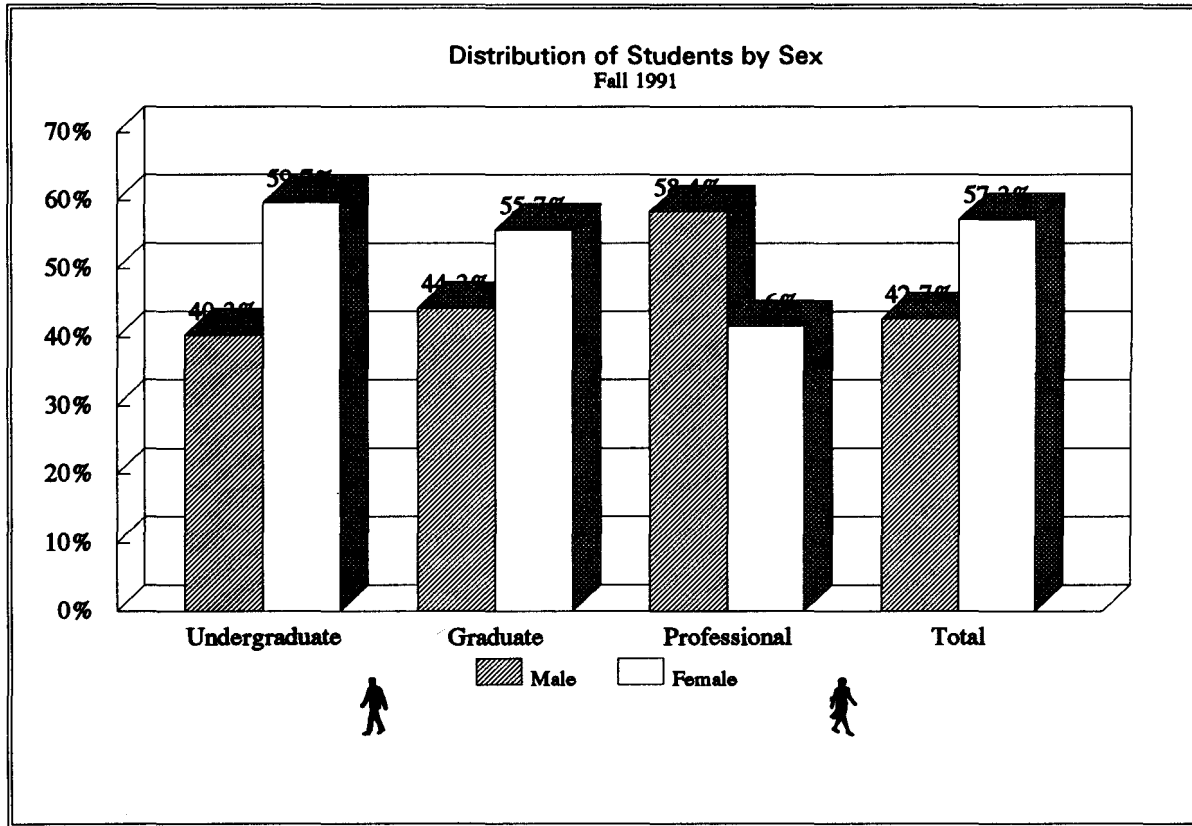

In 1991, 57.3% of the total enrollment was female and 42.7% was male. The percentage of graduate and undergraduate levels were similar to the total enrollment values. At the professional level the percentages were 58.4% male and 41.6% female. Figure 3 and Table 4 show the distributions by school, level and sex.

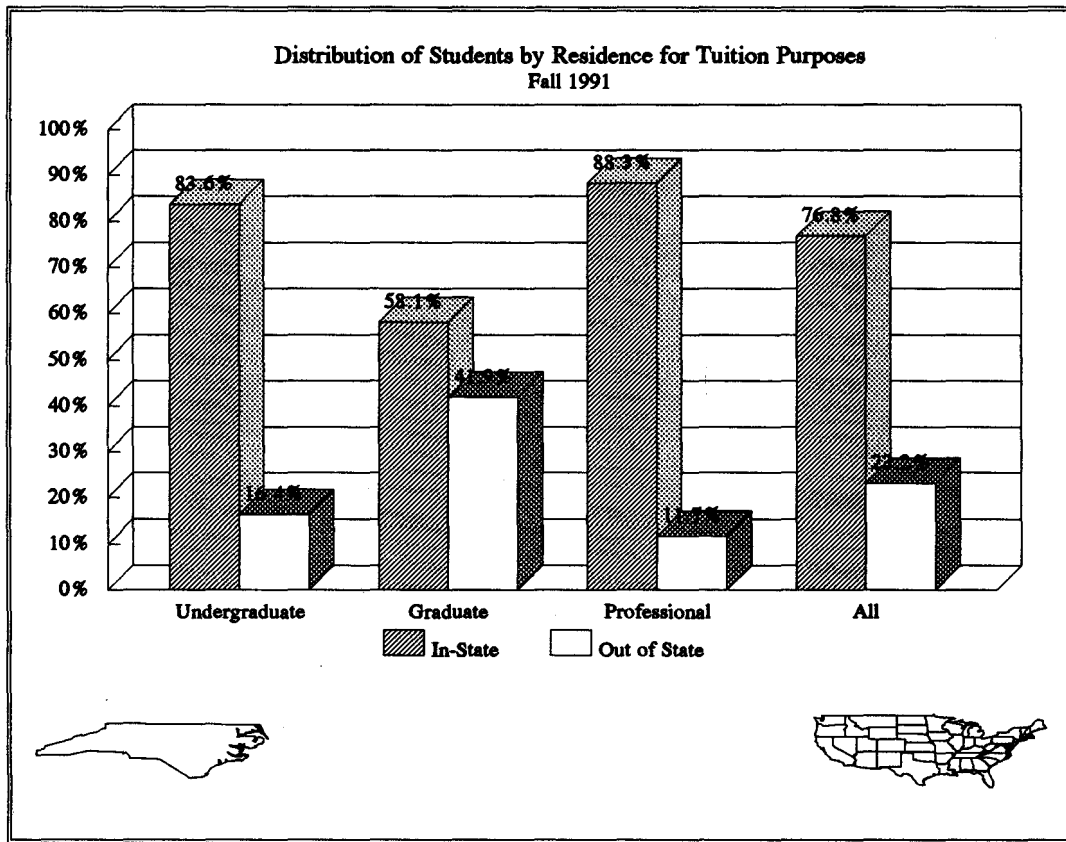


Figure 4 and Table 5 show the distribution of Fall 1991 enrollment by residence for tuition purposes. At the undergraduate and professional levels the students are predominantly in-state at over 80%. At the graduate level the in-state out-of state division is more nearly equal with 58.1 % in state and 41.9% out-of-state.

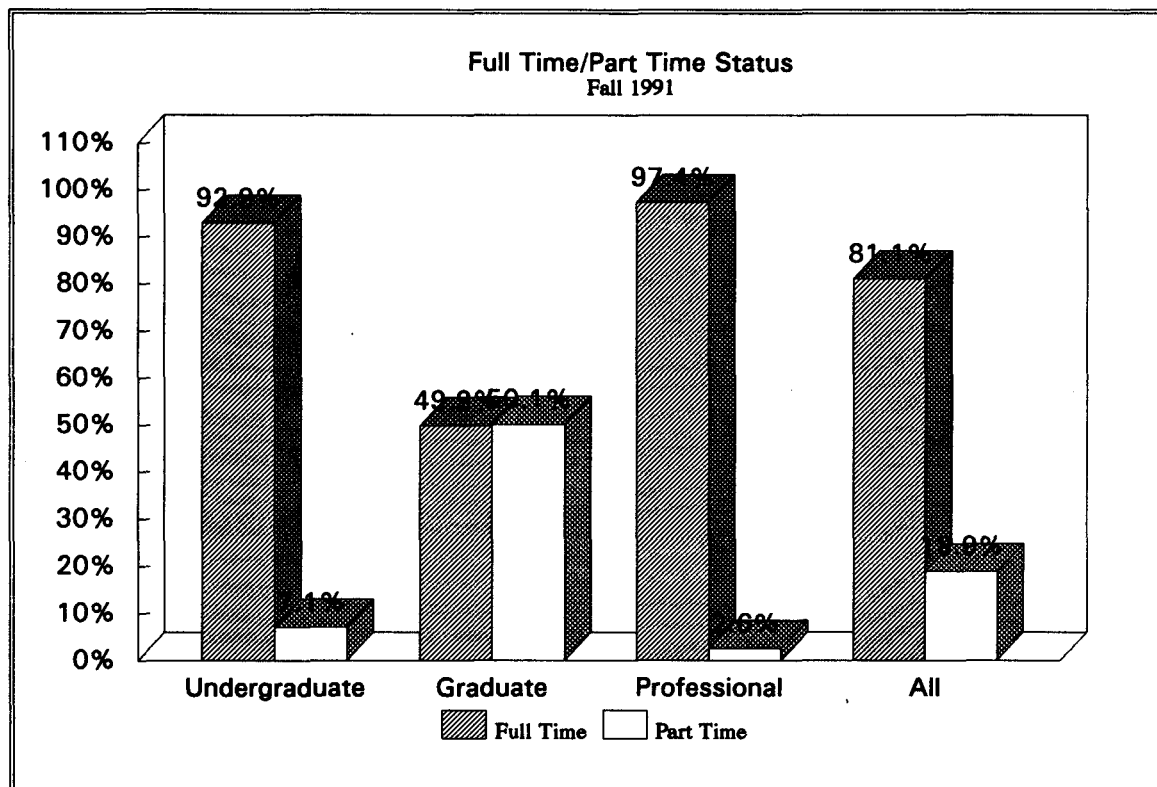


Figure 5 and Table 6 show the distribution of students by school, level, and full/part time status. Undergraduates and professional students are more than 90% full-time while graduate students are nearly equally divided. For the total enrollment 81.1% are full-time and 18.9% are part-time. As would be expected the largest number of part-time students are enrolled in Continuing Studies.

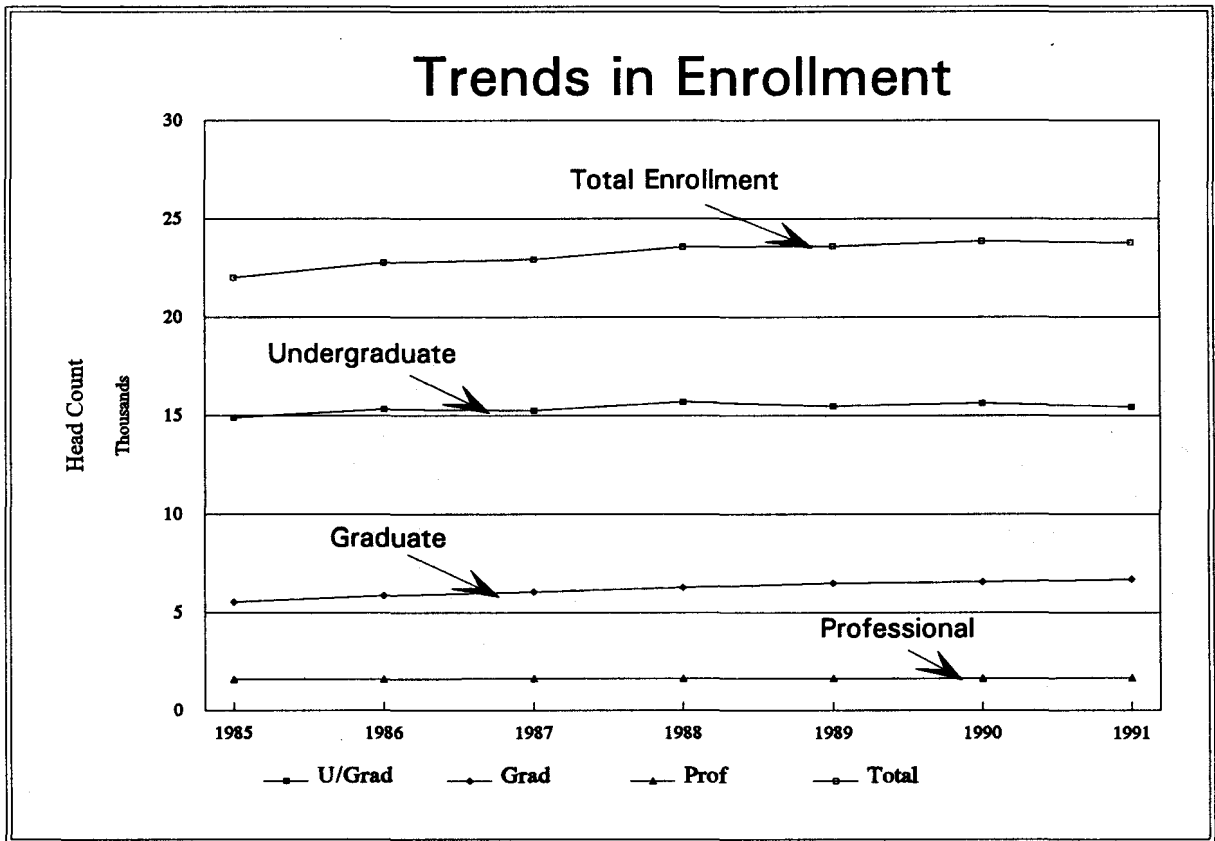

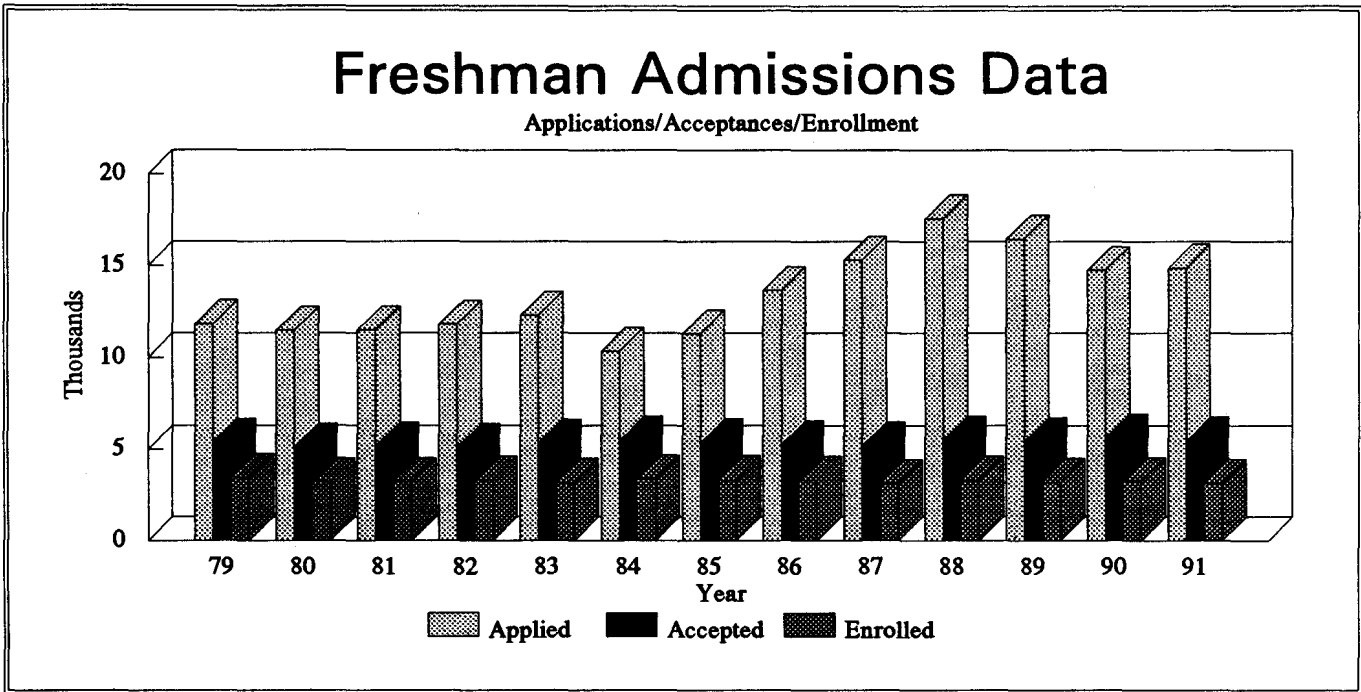
